### A Note from the Governor



What a change two weeks can make. Two weeks ago, I was finalizing the Agenda for the District Board meeting and making sure everything was ready for the District Meeting at Victory Junction. That day I talked with several Civitans and Victory Junction regarding the District Meeting. We were concerned with the coronavirus information we had received, but agreed the District Meeting should not yet be canceled. I went to bed that night without checking on the news of the evening.

When I woke up the next morning, the news was flooded with President Trump suspending travel from Europe, colleges canceling in-person classes and communities canceling events. Then the Governor requested that all large gatherings be discouraged to limit the spread the coronavirus. There were 15 cases in North Carolina.

I realized the District Meeting at Victory Junction would have to be canceled as well as the Board Meeting prior to it. Governor-Elect Terry Jackson and I discussed the current situation and how we could proceed. Just a few days earlier, International had sent a note out to the Governors that they would make their license of Zoom, a video conferencing software solution, available to Districts. My thoughts immediately went to considering if we could conduct both meetings via video conferencing. I had participated in many meetings over the past couple years using Zoom with International staff and fellow District Governors.

## A Note from the Governor

The first person I contacted prior to sending the notice of cancelation was our International President, Patsy Perkel. She was scheduled to visit the District and our District Meeting keynote speaker. We discussed the possibility of having both the District and Board meetings conducted via Zoom. We agreed it should be easy to conduct the Board meeting since our previous meeting had been larger than what the Board meeting would be. The real question was how many participants International's license would cover.

President Patsy shared she was already scheduled to speak with Scarlett Thompson, Executive Vice President at Civitan International that morning. After speaking with Scarlett, she called me and stated Civitan's Zoom license was adequate to cover the District Meeting if I was interested. Scarlett and I had several conversations regarding the scheduling of the meetings and logistics surrounding them. After numerous phone calls with other District officers and speakers who were schedule to be on the agenda, I knew we could proceed with both meetings but adjustments would have to be made.

I immediately sent an email to the Executive Board and Cabinet making them aware the District Meeting at Victory Junction and the in-person Board Meetings were being canceled and each replaced with a video conference. Each was notified the meeting would be at the same scheduled time and provided a Zoom link for it. They were also notified that the District meeting would also be held at 11:00 on the 21<sup>st</sup> via Zoom in an email that would be sent to all members. All Civitans in NCDW then received two different emails regarding the change in the District meeting with the Zoom link. One was sent on that Thursday with the second on Friday prior to the meeting.

Both meetings were a success. The Executive Board was able to address every item that was on the original agenda. The District meeting had in excess of 67 participants. Every presentation except one that was originally scheduled for Victory Junction was presented. We still had President Patsy give our keynote presentation. My only regret was missing the visit to Victory Junction with the activities scheduled that morning and the fellowship before and after the meeting. I have posted a link to the District Meeting on our District Facebook page for those unable to attend. The biggest news from the Board meeting probably is that all Spring Area Meetings have been canceled.

Our District is the first who have used Zoom in this current crisis to conduct their meetings. We had the Governor of NC District East sit in on both the Board and District Meetings. They have already contacted me to learn more since they are looking at the possibility of doing the same now.

Clubs have canceled their meetings together with fundraisers canceled or deferred, projects canceled and banquets canceled or deferred. We will get through this crisis. Our clubs will begin meeting again. Clubs will engage in projects. Fundraisers will be conducted. Until we can do these things, I encourage each club to see how they might be able to engage their members. You may want to consider club emails to members or virtual meetings. Currently, International is having Zoom meetings each day on a different topic. They began on March 24<sup>th</sup> and will continue for the foreseeable future. 
